1.10pm What is play? The importance of play and its role in healthy childhood development

Anne Houghton, Early Childhood Consultant

With over 38 years in the industry, Anne has seen many changes in early childhood education. She has extensive sector experience as a kindergarten teacher, author of children's books and as a community radio host, and her presentation will provide an important context for the value of the provision of a range play spaces in our communities.

1.30pm Play Ground Strategy Development

Case Study 1:

City of Greater Geelong Play Strategy,

Wendy Holland, communityvibe

Wendy is the Director of *communityvibe*, a consultancy specialising in community planning, and sport, recreation and forestry based projects. Wendy prepared the Greater Geelong Play Strategy, which is innovative in its approach by advocating a range of incidental play opportunities in non-traditional locations around the municipality, including within streetscape settings. The strategy recommends a selection of play opportunities that in today's somewhat sanitised approach to playgrounds might appear challenging for children with the perception of being 'risky'.

Case Study 2:

City of Wodonga Playground Strategy,

Debra Mudra, City of Wodonga

Debra is Council's Acting Director Community Development, and was the principal researcher and author of the strategy. Wodonga City is a rapidly growing rural municipality, and Council recognised the importance of having an endorsed framework and approach to guide the future planning and development of new and upgraded play spaces. A majority of the research and input underpinning this strategy was sourced from children – learn innovative research techniques in observing and engaging with children from this presentation.

2.30pm Latest Trends in Play Space Design, Placement, Settings and Functions

Ric is one of Australia's leading play space designers having won numerous industry awards for producing unique and exciting play spaces in a range of settings and forms. His presentation will provide delegates with an informative, entertaining and stimulating insight into the latest and greatest in play space design, construction and use. Two of Ric's award winning playgrounds are included in the site tours on Tuesday and Wednesday: the Geelong Special Play Space and Wombat Bend Play Space.

Drawing on examples, the panel will discuss different models of play work and play programming, including ArtPlay, supervised adventure play, street play, playrangers and play pods; as well as reflections on free unstructured play in different settings.

The Venny is a communal backyard and play space for children aged 5 - 16 years. The Venny clubhouse was recently upgraded and is a sustainable, purpose-built facility and helped launch the 'new' Venny in November 2010.



11.45am Geelong Special Play Space

The Geelong Special Play Space is set in Geelong's historic Botanic Gardens and is designed to encourage social interaction amongst children of all ages and abilities with a focus on including play opportunities for children with physical, social and intellectual disabilities.

1.15pm Eastern Beach Park

Eastern Beach is a popular swimming and recreation area on the shores of Corio Bav. Geelong. It is an all-ages play space with 1930s Art Deco style buildings, a shark proof sea bath, a children's swimming pool, a playground, kiosk, and dressing pavilion.

2.30pm Western Beach & Youth Precinct

Aaron Wallis (Playce Pty Ltd) designed this multi-award winning Youth Precinct, and he will lead a presentation and discussion for delegates.



The Precinct incorporates skatable spaces within a flexible use community activity area for people of all ages.
