Briefing and Workshop - New Playground Standards Part 0-AS4685-2014

Managing risk is the key issue for everyone committed to improving the health and well-being of our community, especially our children and young people. Part 0 has been developed recently by the Australian Playgrounds Standards Committee and deals with all matters related to the Development, Design and Maintenance of playgrounds in Australia. Play Australia SA invites you to attend a briefing on the new Playground Standard Part 0, AS4685-2014 followed by discussion on how best to use this new Standard, applying the principles of "Getting the Balance Right", our recently launched Guide on Risk Management in playspaces throughout South Australia.

This session will provide detailed information to all participants on this new and important Playground Standard which will be invaluable in assisting you and your workplaces to become familiar with the details of the new Standard to better manage the risks involved in outdoor play, and to bring greater confidence to all staff involved in this important activity.

This session will also facilitate discussion on Case Studies documented in Getting the Balance Right – Risk Management for Play, a Play Australia publication published in 2016 with capacity to consider participant's real life case studies in SA.

The presenters for the day are Elizabeth Cummins of Bricolage Design and Rob Hamilton of Park and Playspace.

Elizabeth is a qualified landscape architect and educator. She has spent many years working in private design practice, local government and education. A passionate advocate for free play, Elizabeth is a founding coordinator of the Creative Cubby Project, a regional play initiative. In 2015 Elizabeth co-authored Getting the Balance Right – Risk Management for Play for Play Australia. She has most recently been a contributing editor for the international publication How To Grow A Playspace; Design and Development due to be published by Routledge Publishers UK in 2017. She speaks and blogs regularly on play and projects for children at www.bricolagedesign.com.au.

Rob is a Landscape Architect who has worked for local government for several years and now works independently in playspace development and design. Rob's award-winning playspaces include Yarra Glen Adventure Playground and Zina Grove Reserve (Mooroolbark). His design philosophy is centred on the creation of attractive, landscaped spaces that maximise play value, are easy to maintain, and include lots of rocks! Rob works in partnership with Fern (7) and Griffin (5), who insist on being allowed to test drive all his playspace projects.

November Networking Event @ Anderson Court Outback Adventure Playspace & Campbelltown Preschool

A jammed pack tour of Campbelltown showcased several key initiatives that recognised children as important members of the local community. Campbelltown City has shown great leadership in this field and has been recognised by UNICEF as a child friendly city in 2015.

Cross pollination of policies and projects highlighted on the tour showed the reward of community partnerships. OPAL in collaboration with the council and the Department of Education have worked seamlessly together to ensure that children and families have a true sense of belonging and place.



Our first port of call was Campbelltown Preschool where Site Leader Jasmine Milbanks provided insight into the Nature Play makeover that occurred in 2015 as part of a DECD demonstration site. The key objective was to provide enhanced opportunities for play based learning in a nature inspired setting. The outdoor learning area provides a flexible and challenging play experience and provides a diversity of sensory and social play destinations. Children's voice and connection with the wider community was highly regarded in the design to create a place to connect and belong.



Within a stones throw we made our way to the revamped and award winning public playspace Anderson Court Outback Adventure Playspace. Erica Vidinis council's Landscape Architect provided an insightful background to the creation of a dynamic and educational community playspace. The playspace on plan view may feel compact but from a child's eye provides a maze of opportunities to explore and discover native animals in a sculptural form. Once again children's voice was actively consulted utilising established partnership relationships thus providing a popular destination for future generations

Last but not least Gavin Fairbrother from OPAL and Community Development Officer Tracey Nelder closed the morning session with an overview of a global community and play initiative known as Street Play. OPAL Campbelltown has successfully empowered and supported local neighborhood road closures to provide a safe place to play and socialise as was common prior to the domination of the motor car. OPAL has created a suite of documents that cuts the red tape ensuring that once again local kids can play together and make friends on their doorstep.

Thanks once again to all our hosts for their time and insight into the possibilities of community partnerships in enhancing play environments in an urban setting.
