PASA Constitution and Strategic Plan

Play Australia has developed a Strategic Plan 2014-19 to provide a clear pathway to grow and transform the organisation.

This document sets out what Play Australia needs to do over the next five years and beyond to grow the organisation and position itself as the 'go-to' organisation for all matters about children's play.

The five Key Strategic Areas (KSAs) represent the areas of activity in which Play Australia needs to focus its efforts over the next 5 years in order to realise its Phase 1 vision. The KSAs are:

- Membership acquisition
- Revenue growth
- Strategic communication
- Adequate staffing
- Board experience

The Play Australia (IPA Australia) Incorporated Constitution was adopted at the 2015 Annual General Meeting. This document sets out Play Australia's rules and purposes. It is broken down into numbered clauses, with subclauses.

Getting the Balance Right, a presentation on Play Australia Risk Management Guide

In February this year PASA was excited to host a forum by Liz Cummins, author of 'Getting the Balance Right – Risk Management for Play', kindly hosted by the City of Charles Sturt.

Liz provided an engaging and stimulating summary of the guide and challenged the audience to consider their role in providing high quality, well maintained play opportunities and environments which create play value and promote the benefits of risk.

The main focus of the presentation was to unpack the thinking behind what we do as professionals and how we do it. Evaluating the decisions made with regards to the creation of play environments whilst considering the provision of public safety and compliance with standards and regulations.



The guide asks many questions and encourages an objective and balanced approach to play provision and Liz asked the same of the audience.

The later part of the morning session was broken up into a workshop format where we worked in groups to consider opportunities provided to us as children, and how these differ from the current external environments which we are able to create for this generation of children. Group discussions provided some interesting themes and outcomes which lead us into reviewing current challenges presented to us by our different work place environments.

Liz also discussed how the guide provides a series of case studies which showcase commendable work already being done in the sectors of play provision. The risk benefit assessment strategies and frameworks discussed in these projects are considered and from a variety of sources, and work in conjunction with expert guidance and advice.

The session was concluded with a summary highlighting that public safety is an important issue, but not the only issue that needs to be considered in the creation of play environments and that a holistic approach is required to benefit communities, young people and families into the future.

The guide will be available through Play Australia as a free download to members on the website in the coming months, please look out for updates as to when it will be available.
