What is Inclusion?




Access ≠ Inclusion

A truly inclusive playspace goes well beyond access. An inclusive playspace is where we all want to go, where everyone can participate, we all are welcome and feel we belong. Bespoke, universal, inclusive design = INCLUSION We challenge and change the way we use, design and build public spaces.



What is Inclusion?







INCLUSIVE - meaning its for EVERYONE, all ages, all stages, all backgrounds and all circumstances to feel safe, supported and comfortable to PARTICIPATE, with VALUE, in whatever capacity they CHOOSE, on any given day.



If you adjust an activity or cater for supports you deliver for all






What does this look like?

TOP TIPS to Inclusive (Outdoor) Play



- 1. We change the environment or the activity
- 2. Watch and observe Give space and time
- 3. Remember access is not inclusion participation
- 4. The child and the family are the experts
- 5. Think function and use put it in the plan!
- 6. It's not rocket science More than one way to do it
