Update from Catherine Hunt of DECD regarding Preschool Outdoor Learning Area (POLA)

The Preschool Outdoor Learning Area (POLA) Project is part of a suite of State Government investments into the early years.

The POLA project will provide more opportunities for children to play outdoors, be active and learn new skills through the construction of 20 outdoor learning areas in pre-schools across the state over a four year period.

The sites will be demonstration sites to provide a wider range of play possibilities for our children that promote learning and development, are challenging, engender a feeling of security and wellbeing and build a sense of community.

The project objectives are to:

- demonstrate the principles and values of authentic engagement with children, families and the local community
- strengthen communities through the design of culturally appropriate environments
- redevelop the outdoor environments in each of the sites to demonstrate the philosophy and practice of nature play in outdoor learning environments
- develop a space that fosters interaction, autonomy, explorations, curiosity and communication and places for children and adults to research together
- illustrate how and why the curriculum and the children drive the environment - to understand and promote the relationship between the outdoor learning environment and children's learning and the pedagogical practices that enhance children's learning.

Preschool sites participating in the project will be concept leaders and support other educators to actively engage children, families and the local community in connecting with nature.

- Wandana Child Parent Centre
- Sturt Street Children's Centre
- Madge Sexton Kindergarten
- Campbelltown Preschool
- Melaleuca Park Kindergarten
