### Meet the Committee |

#### Mason Willis

**Place of Work:** City of Mitcham

I'm the Manager Open Space at the City of Mitcham in SA and have been part of the Mitcham team for 2 and a half years. The Open Space team have proudly renewed 10 playgrounds across the City in that time. The team is a diverse group of generalists and specialists including arborists, a trail officer, volunteer coordinator, native vegetation expert and 2 open space asset deliverers. Our mission statement is 'To work with our community to deliver the best open space experience, for a better life, for every person'. We have 945 hectares of open space and 63 playgrounds, over 75,000 trees and over 40km of mixed use trails for cycling and walking. It's a joy to work in the City of Mitcham and I'm always open to learning about ways to improve our play and recreation experiences.



#### What prompted you to join Play Australia?

I attended the Play SA Inclusive Playspace conference in Adelaide in October 2021 and was blown away by the breadth of expertise and knowledge in the room. The innovation, research and consideration being invested in the playgrounds and play spaces that were presented was both amazing and incredibly encouraging. In addition to this, a presentation by Helen Connolly, SA's first commissioner for Children and Young People was enlightening as it showed me there is a whole industry behind making the lives of children and young people better - something we are striving towards in the Open Space team. After the Play SA conference I really felt that if I could get involved and in some small way make a positive contribution, that would be a success.

#### Why is being a member of Play Australia important to you as a professional in the sector?

The opportunity to make a positive difference is a core driver for me. But on a more personal level, being a proud father of a 5 year old and 1 year old, I have a captive test audience for things that do and don't work in the world of play! I love learning about innovations and, importantly, the ongoing research about how children learn through play and the most effective ways. Play is a universal right and shapes futures. If I can learn how to do it better through working with Play SA, that will be fantastic.

#### Can you tell us about what you hope to do for play in SA?

The City of Mitcham has a strong strategic focus on sustainability and I am keen to further drive the understanding of the circular economy with regards to playgrounds and playspaces. A lot of the playgrounds we are renewing have withstood the test of time in terms of durability but are largely made from un-recyclable materials. Let's start to consider the whole asset lifecycle for a greener future.
